# HIGHLIGHTS :

At JJC, we are excited to share the essential work we have accomplished in the past month! We could not achieve this without your continued support, advocacy, and passion for a better future for our youth.

#### Packed with Policy

August has been a month of small wins with a big impact. TaKasha Smith, JJC Executive Director, was asked to join the Juvenile Justice Subcommittee of the Ohio Sentencing Commission. This commission includes a diverse group of professionals such as judges, prosecuting and defense attorneys, behavioral health professionals, academics, and more. This is a paramount win for JJC because we get to have our voice at the table to ensure that youth aren't given unfair, discriminatory sentences that will cause their rehabilitation to decline.

TaKasha has continued to meet with DYS to continue to promote community-based care initiatives to the leadership team.

Another significant policy win in the community is that Columbus City Schools District will be following Board Policy 5771, which directs that no student be searched without reasonable suspicion or in an unreasonable manner. This is in response to the unconstitutional policy CCS implemented to do random searches upon student arrival to school. Students should always feel safe going to school, not afraid that their rights will be infringed on.

#### **Communities Coming Together**

Don't forget that JJC will be hosting our first monthly coalition meeting in September via Zoom. You will not want to miss it! We will be giving you updates on what we're working on, brainstorming as a team, and creating tangible action steps you can take today to help support the work we do.
